# FIPPA Basics

- What is the purpose of FIPPA?
  - Access to Information
  - Protection of Privacy (our focus!)
- Unique in BC
  - Data Residency
- COVID-19 Ministerial Order M085
  - Allows the storage/access of personal information outside of Canada without consent
  - Allows for the swift movement of operations to the online environment
  - Problem – it is a temporary measure!

# In the New Normal...

- Still required to notify about the collection of personal information.
  - How do we do that?
- Still responsible for the security of personal information.
- With M085 set to expire in late June, how should faculty plan now for Fall (or even the end of Summer term)?
